OVERTURE

The Southeast Asian Housing forum was designed to address issues pertaining housing in its namesake region. These issues may range from cultural and heritage aspects to future projection research and assessing current administrative problems. Under the previous and first season of the forum held in October 2011 by the Asian Reseach Center for Housing, housing culture and heritage of the component countries of Southeast Asian was discussed by academicians and professionals in an intellectual atmosphere at Kyung Hee University, Seoul.

The length and breadth of the topic opened under the previous round of talks demanded a continuation of similar discussions, and to establish a tradition in this regard, Universiti Teknologi Malaysia decided to host the second season here at the city of its base, Johor Bahru, Malaysia.

Johor Bahru deserves a special attention as the site for the largest development corridor south of Peninsular Malaysia, termed Iskandar Development Region, and Universiti Teknologi Malaysia boasts as the pioneering institute of higher learning and research in the country in the fields of architecture, planning and housing.



Background of Iskandar Malaysia

Iskandar Malaysia (IM) corridor was established on 30 July 2006 and the project is administered by Iskandar Regional Development Authority (IRDA). It is set to become South Peninsular Malaysia's most developed region, where living, recreation, the environment and business seamlessly converge within a bustling and vibrant metropolis.

Economic Growth

The first of its kind, Iskandar Malaysia has been allocated RM6.83 billion by the Government. Encompassing a vast area as the largest single development project ever to be undertaken in the region.



THEME: HOUSING FOR PEOPLE - PRESENT AND FUTURE CHALLENGES

Southeast Asian consists of 11 countries between the Indian and the Pacific Oceans. Around 620 million inhabitants make Southeast Asia one of the most populated regions in the world.

With an urban population ratio of about 43% (2010) this region is the second least urbanized in the world after Africa. This follows in turn its second place in the world's fastest urbanization rates with a 2.5% per annum (2005-2010). This rapid growth puts some serious constraints on the housing market in the region that happens to possess one of the highest population density rates in the world as well. It could easily be claimed that nearly all the countries in the region face significant issues in the housing sector in one way or another, from oversupply and market glut to excessive demand and inflation on housing rates, all the way to transportation issues, shortage or defiance of standards and legislations, human constraints and psychological pressures to security and urban politics. This forum in continuation of a tradition established in 2011 seeks to address these issues and challenges as posed today and predicted of the future. It therefore pursues the following goals:

- + to establish long term collaborative learning
- + to provide a platform for information sharing
- + to discuss emerging issues and challenges
- + to enhance academic undertaking on housing studies in Southeast Asia





SUBTHEMES:

In keeping with the theme – 'Housing for People - present & future challenges' – the contents of this Forum are broadly divided into 4 sub-themes namely Human Factors in Housing, Housing Affordability, Urban Politics and Sustainability in Southeast Asian. The subjects within the sub-themes are listed below:

Sub-theme 1: Human Factors in Housing

Agenda: The utilitarian nature of contemporary housing supply in the region has caused disturbances in the optimal social interactions or comfort expected from a healthy human society. Detailed study of these issues is welcomed by the current forum.

Sub-theme 2: Housing Affordability

Agenda: The unmitigated population growth in the region driven by the motors of cultural encouragement and financial or health illiteracy puts pressure on both the housing supply as well as the financial capacity of the families. In most component countries, e.g. Myanmar, Philippines, Indonesia, Vietnam, Combodia and Laos, the majority of the population lives below the poverty line in spite of the occasionally significant national GDP rates. In the others that do better, e.g. Malaysia, Singapore, Thailand and Brunei, skyrocketing inflation presents a bleak future in the financial capacities of the families. Issues on this subject are to be discussed.

They coexist within an integrated system and run on clean, renewable energy. They make the best use of local resources, using materials which are recycled and reused.






EXHIBITION BOOKING FORM

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He received his early education at the Malay College Kuala Kangsar and went on to further his studies in town planning at the Heriot-Watt University in Edinburgh, Scotland. He is registered with the Board of Town Planners Malaysia and started his career in the civil service in 1983 as a town planning officer attached to the Federal Department of Town and Country Planning, Ministry of Housing and Local Government. ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR ROXANA WATERSON

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
